

How to Socially Distance Your Patio from Pests

A sighting of a mouse or clusters of flies buzzing around restaurants can prompt negative social media attention. It can also lead to failed inspections and audits by Public Health. Some pests are simply annoying, while others can carry pathogens and potentially dangerous diseases and, in the case of stingers, painful allergic reactions.

With restrictions lifting and patios opening, waste disposal will increase; rats, mice, and a whole slew of other insects will make their way back to areas abandoned since the pandemic once again.

What's the best way to keep pests away and ensure a successful patio season?

- Keep trash cans tightly sealed to prevent rodents and flies from getting in and odours from getting out. Be sure to seal food waste in sealed plastic bags and empty and clean bins regularly.
- ➤ Clear tables with plates that contain food as quickly as possible. These serve as an invitation for flies.
- While potted flowers and greenery are attractive, they are a haven for stinging insects. Avoid planting colourful or fragrant flowers near your patio. Try fake foliage instead, it looks good and is less attractive!
- Remove any standing water. The smallest amount of water is a breeding ground for mosquitoes.
- Wipe away crumbs on tables and sweep patio floors as ants look for crumbs left behind by guests.
- Keep restaurant doors closed when not in use to eliminate the potential of insects and rodents from getting inside your restaurant.
